#### Love letters from World War II, complemented by archival photos and AI-generated images

Photographer Hanno Ketterer opens a box from his grandmother's estate. Inside, he finds almost 1,000 field letters that his grandfather, as a German soldier during World War II, wrote from the front to his beloved wife at home — in freezing nights and scorching heat, from rain-soaked and dusty shelters. Outside, there was fear, violence, and deprivation. But the letters reveal something else: love and hope. Moved by this true and courageous love story, he launches the book project *love letters from the war*.

What is remarkable is not only the deeply personal family story Ketterer tells, but also the book's distinctive design. The artist combines original letters and historical photographs with Algenerated images and contemporary narration. In doing so, he recreates a world that no longer exists. He takes the reader on a journey through time, making the events of the Second World War emotionally tangible.

The combination of these generated images with original family photos anchors the story in reality. I hope that the reader can feel the love and hope both in the images and in the written words.

My dear Grete!

All my letters were meant to be, and still aim to be, love letters in the truest sense. Love – pure, the most beautiful human love brought us together. The eternal hatred among people separated us. (Karl's letter to Grete, West of the Vistula, 27 October 1944)

Ketterer's *love letters from the war* is a moving, timeless love story about the will to seek comfort in small moments. A profoundly personal work, yet one that moves on a universal level.

Hanno Ketterer worked in management consulting before beginning photography studies in Amsterdam in 2022. His debut *love letters from the war* marks the beginning of a promising career in photography.


